
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-NINE.

AN ACT to regulate the taking and shooting of pigeons.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Whoever wilfully commits any trespass by killing

- 2 pigeons on or frightening them from beds made
- 3 for the purpose of taking them in nets, by firing
- 4 guns or in any other manner, within one hundred
- 5 rods of the same, except on lands lawfully occupied
- 6 by himself, shall be punished by imprisonment in
- 7 the jail not exceeding thirty days, or by fine not
- 8 exceeding twenty dollars; and shall also be liable
- 9 for the actual damages to the owner or occupant
- 10 of such beds.
