RESOLVE in favor of James Cousins, Jr.

Resolved, That the treasurer be authorized to

- 2 reimburse James Cousins, Jr., thirty-three dollars
- 3 and ten cents, being the amount paid to Edwin C.
- 4 Burleigh, land agent, by Hardy Lane, for the pur-
- 5 chase of Conary's island, November twenty-first,
- 6 eighteen hundred seventy-six, and that the said
- 7 sum be appropriated.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

STATE OF MAINE, LAND OFFICE, Augusta, Jan. 31, 1879.

Black or Conary island was sold with other islands at public auction in Rockland, by the Land Agent, under the direction of the Governor and Council, to William Conary and Hardy Lane, November 21, 1876, for eighty-five dollars.

Mr. Conary applied to the last Legislature for re-imbursement of money paid by him, and the sum of fifty-one dollars ninety cents was appropriated for that purpose by resolve approved February 5, 1878.

It appears by the deed to Mr. Conary that twenty acres, more than one-half the island, were conveyed to him.
