STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-NINE.

AN ACT additional to chapter six of the revised statutes, relating to suits for lands sold for non-payment of taxes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

No person shall be permitted to commence, main2' tain or defend any action, in law or equity,
3 involving the validity of any sale of land for non4 payment of taxes, until the amount of all taxes,
5 interest and costs, arising under such sale, and of
6 all taxes paid after such sale and interest thereon,
7 shall be deposited with the clerk of the court in
8 which such action shall be commenced, by the
9 party contesting the validity of the sale, to be paid
10 out by order of court to the party legally and
11 equitably entitled thereto.
