STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY.

AN ACT relating to state officers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Whoever shall knowingly and falsely

- 2 assume to be any state officer of the state of Maine,
- 3 and to act as such, or shall knowingly and falsely
- 4 assume to discharge any of the duties of any such
- 5 officer, or shall knowingly and wilfully invite, or
- 6 receive any communication, document, record, or
- 7 letter, properly belonging to any such state officer,
- 8 or relating to the office, or official business of said
- 9 officer, or shall in any way knowingly and wilfully
- 10 obstruct, or delay any such officer in the discharge
- 11 of any of his official duties, shall be punished by
- 12 imprisonment, not less than one nor more than five

13 years and by fine not exceeding five thousand 14 dollars.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
