STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of John Anderson of Island Falls.

Resolved, That the sum of thirty-three dollars 2 and twenty cents, with interest thereon from 3 November twenty-seventh, eighteen hundred and 4 seventy-one, be appropriated and paid to John 5 Anderson of Island Falls, being for stumpage of 6 timber cut on his lot and received by the State.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

John Anderson, (a Norwegian), sent his notes to the Land Office in the fall of 1869, for lot 59, Island Falls, and was regarded as the purchaser of the lot, although a land certificate was not issued to him until June 9, 1870. The land was conveyed to him by Edwin C. Burleigh, Land Agent, August 16, 1877, said Anderson having made full payment therefor in road labor and performed settling duties as required by law.

In the winter of 1869-'70, a permit was issued by the State to Bonj. B. Byron of certain lands in Island Falls. Byron made an arrangement with Mr. Anderson by which he, Byron, was to cut some timber on said lot, the stumpage to be paid to the State, and with the understanding that said Anderson, after having performed settling duties as required by law, and receiving deed of the lot would be entitled to be reimbursed by the State for the stumpage. The stumpage was received by the State, November 27, 1871.
