STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY.

AN ACT to amend chapter eighty-four of the public laws of eighteen hundred seventy-nine, relating to river fisheries.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section one of chapter eighty-four of the laws of

- 2 eighteen hundred and seventy-nine, is hereby
- 3 amended by striking out the word "fifteenth" in
- 4 said section and inserting the words "twenty-fifth"
- 5 instead thereof, so that said section as amended
- 6 shall read as follows:
- 7 Sect. 1. The limit of depth prescribed for
- 8 weirs in section thirty-four of chapter forty of the
- 9 revised statutes of eighteen hundred and seventy-
- 10 one, shall be measured at the entrance of the weir;

11 provided, that no part of such weir known as the 12 leader, shall be in more than two feet depth of 13 water at low water mark. Weirs may exceed the 14 limit of two feet depth measured as aforesaid, 15 under the following conditions, namely: First, 16 the distance from the before mentioned two feet 17 limit of depth to the entrance of such weir, shall 18 not exceed one hundred feet. Second, no such 19 weir shall obstruct more than one-eighth part of 20 the width of the channel. Third, every such weir 21 shall be stripped so as to render it incapable of 22 taking fish on and after the twenty-fifth day of 23 June annually; these conditions to apply only to 24 weirs that exceed the aforesaid limit of depth. 25 The standard for low water mark on the Kennebec 26 river shall in all cases be the nearest bench mark 27 of the United States coast survey, allowance being 28 made at the various points for the difference in 29 time.
