STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY.

AN ACT to amend section one of chapter eleven of the revised statutes, authorizing the consolidation of schools in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section one of chapter eleven of the revised stat-2 utes is hereby amended by adding thereto the fol-3 lowing words, to wit: "but when in the judgment 4 of the board consisting of the municipal officers 5 and superintending school committee or supervisor 6 the number of scholars in any district becomes too 7 few for the profitable expenditure of the money ap-8 portioned to said district, said board may suspend 9 the school in said district and cause the money to 10 be expended for the benefit of the scholars in said

11 district in the adjoining district or districts. Said 12 board shall make a record of its decision in rela-13 tion to the school in said district, sign the same and 14 cause it to be recorded by the town clerk, and such 15 decision shall remain in full force until annulled by 16 vote of the town or by the action of a subsequent 17 board. Said board may reserve not more than one-18 half of the money appropriated to such districts to 19 be expended in their discretion, for the conveyance 20 of children of such districts to and from school," so 21 that when amended said section shall read as fol-22 lows:

23 Sect. 1. A town at its annual meeting, or at a 24 meeting called for that purpose, may determine the 25 number and limits of the school districts therein, 26 but they shall not be altered, discontinued or an-27 nexed to others except on the written recommen-28 dation of the municipal officers and superintending 29 school committee, accompanied by a statement of 30 facts, and on conditions proper to preserve the 31 rights and obligations of the inhabitants; but 32 when in the judgment of the board consisting of 33 the municipal officers and superintending school 34 committee or supervisor, the number of scholars in 35 any district becomes too few for the profitable ex-36 penditure of the money apportioned to said district, 37 said board may suspend the school in said district 38 and cause the money to be expended, for the ben-39 efit of the scholars in said district, in the adjoining 40 district or districts. Said board shall make a record 41 of its decision in relation to the school in said dis-42 trict, sign the same and cause it to be recorded by 43 the town clerk, and such decision shall remain in 44 full force until annulled by vote of the town or by 45 the action of a subsequent board. Said board may 46 reserve not more than one-half of the money appro-47 priated to such districts to be expended, in their 48 discretion, for the conveyance of children of such 49 districts to and from school.
