STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of road leading from Fish river mills to Daigle mills in township number seventeen, range six, Aroostook county.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred dollars be
2 appropriated for the repair of the road leading from
3 Fish river mills to Daigle mills in township number
4 seventeen, range six, in Aroostook county.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This road was made through a thick woods and was not fully completed, and the parties making farms in hauling lumber for building purposes on said township seventeen, range six, said road is badly cut up; the settlers are making their farms and are unable to repair said road, and unless this small sum is granted said road will be wholly impassable, and what has been done will be lost.
