## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY.

AN ACT to amend section two, chapter ninety-four of the revised statutes, relating to process of forcible entry and detainer.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section two of chapter ninety-four of the revised

- 2 statutes, is hereby amended by striking out in the
- 3 tenth line the words, "a third party," and inserting
- 4 in place thereof the words, "another party;" also
- 5 by adding the following clause: "Provided, that
- 6 in all actions under this act, the tenant shall have
- 7 the right of appeal, on giving satisfactory security
- 8 to the justice, or court before which the process is
- 9 brought, to pay reasonable rent, damage and costs
- 10 from and after the date of said appeal," so that
- 11 said section as amended shall read as follows:

12 All tenancies at will may be determined 13 by either party, by thirty days' notice in writing 14 for that purpose, given to the other party, and not 15 otherwise except by mutual consent and excepting 16 cases where the tenant is liable to pay rent and no 17 rent is due at the time the notice expires; when 18 terminated the tenant is liable to the process afore-19 said, without further notice and without proof of 20 any relation of landlord and tenant, unless he has 21 paid after service of the notice, rent that accrued 22 after the termination of the tenancy. These provis-23 ions shall apply to tenancies of buildings erected 24 on land of another party; provided, that in all 25 actions under this act, the tenant shall have the 26 right of appeal, on giving satisfactory security to 27 the justice or court before which the process is 28 brought, to pay reasonable rent, damage and costs 29 from and after the date of said appeal.
