STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY.

AN ACT to amend section seventeen of chapter one hundred thirty-two of the revised statutes relating to fees of trial justices.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Section seventeen of chapter one hundred and 2 thirty-two of the revised statutes is hereby amended 3 by inserting after the word "party," in the fourth 4 line thereof, the words, "or convicts a party, and 5 such party appeals and is finally acquitted," so that 6 said section as amended shall read as follows:

7 *Sect. 17.* When several warrants are issued by 8 any magistrate where only one is necessary, he 9 shall be allowed only the costs for one complaint 10 and warrant; and when he binds over a party, and 11 the grand jury do not find an indictment against

12 such party, or convicts a party and such party
13 appeals and is finally acquitted, he shall not have
14 any fees in the case, unless the same are certified
15 and approved by the county attorney; and in no
16 case shall he tax other or greater fees than are ex-
17 pressly allowed by law.
