STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Accompanying the Resolve in favor of the St. Elizabeth Orphan Asylum.

This institution has been in successful operation for several years. It has its principal asylum at Whitefield, in this State, where it supports over fifty boys. At Portland it has a branch asylum, where it has some thirty girls and one boy, of different ages from two years old to sixteen. The children are taken regardless of creed or race. The majority of the boys are taught agriculture. All are given a good education, and are taught the useful arts and domestic accomplishments. There are thirteen children whose fathers died in the late war or of wounds there received, and who may justly claim the aid of the State. They are more cheaply kept at these institutions than they can be at Bath, and in many cases are kept at these institutions at the request of parents before their death. They are healthy and happy, and well cared for where they now are.
