STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY.

AN ACT granting permission to John P. Perley, William F. Perry and others to locate and construct a railroad from Bridgton to some point on the line of the Portland and Ogdensburg or Portland and Rochester railroads, not nearer Portland than the village of Saccarappa.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Permission is hereby granted to John P. Perley, 2 William F. Perry, William A. Stevens, Samuel F. 3 Perley, Joseph L. Wales, H. A. Shorey, Samuel 4 C. Smith, Freeman H. Brown, Elias Goff, George 5 G. Farnsworth, James Webb, Jr., Byron Kimball, 6 Luther Billings, William Iredale, Albion G. Brad- 7 street, and their associates, to locate and construct

8 a railroad from the town of Bridgton, in the county
9 of Cumberland, through the Presumpscot valley,
10 to some point on the line of the Portland and
11 Ogdensburg railroad, or Portland and Rochester
12 railroad, not nearer Portland than the village of
13 Saccarappa; *provided*, that no portion of any such
14 railroad be located or constructed nearer any por-
15 tion of the buildings or works of the oriental pow-
16 der mills, in the towns of Gorham and Windham,
17 than the present track of the Portland and Ogdens-
18 burg railroad; *and provided, further*, that said rail-
19 road shall be completed on or before November first,
20 in the year one thousand, eight hundred eighty-
21 four; and permission is hereby granted said John
22 P. Perley, and others aforesaid, and their asso-
23 ciates, to organize under the corporate name of the
24 Bridgton and Presumpscot river railroad company,
25 whenever they shall have complied with the provi-
26 sions required by chapter one hundred twenty of
27 the public laws of the year one thousand eight
28 hundred and seventy-six.
