STATEMENT OF FACTS.

BANGOR CHILDREN'S HOME,
BANGOR, Feb. 3, 1880. }

To the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature
assembled at Augusta, Maine :

The undersigned would respectfully represent that there were during last year in this institution, on an average, twelve soldiers' children. We would petition that an appropriation be made from the State, to aid in the support of said children, of an amount at least one-half as much for each child as may be appropriated to the Soldiers' Orphans' Home at Bath, for a similar purpose.
