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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY.

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AN ACT to incorporate the Commercial Club of  
Portland.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. Weston F. Milliken, William G.  
1 Davis, Richard O. Conant, Lewis Pierce, George  
2 Burnham, Jr., Robinson Williams, and all persons  
3 who are or may hereafter become associated with  
4 them, are hereby created a corporation by the  
5 name of Commercial Club, for the purpose of estab-  
6 lishing and maintaining a club house in the city of  
7 Portland, in this state, and of promoting literary  
8 and social intercourse among its members, and by  
9 that name shall have power to sue and be sued,  
10 and possess all the rights and privileges of corpor-  
12 ations under the laws of this state.

SECT. 2. Such corporation may elect such officers as it may deem necessary, and may take, hold and convey real and personal property to an amount not exceeding seventy-five thousand dollars, and may adopt such constitution, by-laws, rules and regulations, not repugnant to the laws of this state, as they deem necessary for the management of their affairs, including the power to fix and limit the right of members in and to the corporate property, and the manner in which the same shall determine.

SECT. 3. The first meeting of the incorporators may be called by any one of the persons named in the first section of this act, by giving seven days' notice of the time and place of said meeting, by publishing the same in any daily paper in said Portland.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
