STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY.

AN ACT to make the diplomas of normal schools legal certificates to teach in the public schools of the state.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. Any person graduating from either 2 of the three normal schools established and main- 3 tained by the state, and receiving the diploma 4 thereof, is hereby authorized to teach in any of the 5 public schools of this state below the grade of high 6 school, without further examination and certifica- 7 tion by superintending school committees, and 8 shall be exempt from the penalties provided for in 9 section sixty-five of chapter eleven of the revised 10 statutes, relating to forfeitures for teaching with- 11 out a certificate.

SECT. 2. All laws and parts of laws inconsistent
2 herewith are hereby repealed.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect on its approval
2 by the governor.
