STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY.

AN ACT to amend section twenty-six of chapter twenty-seven of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, in relation to lime rock, granite and slate.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section twenty-six of chapter twenty-seven of the
2 public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight
3 is hereby amended so that said section shall read
4 as follows:

5 *Sect. 26.* Any person who digs, hauls, or fur-
6 nishes rock for the manufacture of lime shall have
7 a lien for his personal services on such rock and
8 the lime manufactured therefrom for thirty days
9 after such manufacture; any person, who labors in

10 quarrying, cutting or dressing granite shall have a
11 lien thereon for his personal services for thirty
12 days after such granite is so quarried, cut or
13 dressed; any person who labors in mining, quarry-
14 ing or manufacturing slate shall have a lien thereon
15 for his personal services for thirty days after such
16 slate is so mined, quarried or manufactured; and
17 any person who labors in hauling granite or slate
18 shall have a lien thereon for his personally services
19 for thirty days after such granite or slate is so
20 hauled; *provided, however*, that no lien mentioned
21 in this section shall continue after said lime, gran-
22 ite or slate shall be loaded on cars or vessels for
23 transportation. Such liens shall have precedence
24 of all other claims, and may be enforced by attach-
25 ment within the time aforesaid.
