STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND.

AN ACT to amend an amendment to chapter sixty-six of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, relating to the shore fisheries.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section one of chapter one hundred and twelve of

- 2 the public laws of the year eighteen hundred and
- 3 seventy-nine is hereby amended by striking out
- 4 after the word 'width' in the sixth line of said sec-
- 5 tion the following words: "And such taking or fish-
- 6 ing therefor is also hereby prohibited in any of the
- 7 waters within one nautical mile of the coast or of
- 8 any inhabited island within the jurisdiction of this
- 9 state," so that said section when amended shall
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 Sect. 1. The taking of herring, or porgies or

or menhaden, or fishing therefor by the use of purse and drag seines is hereby prohibited in all of the small bays, inlets, harbors or rivers of this state, where any entrance to the same, or any part thereof from land to land, is not more than two nautical miles in width; under a penalty upon the master or person in charge of such seine or seines of not less than one hundred nor more than three hundred dollars, and there shall be a lien upon the vessels, steamers, boats and apparatus used in such unlawing ful pursuit until said penalty is paid; but a net for meshing porgies of not more than one hundred meshes in depth, and a net for meshing herring of not more than one hundred and seventy meshes in depth, shall not be deemed a seine.
