## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY.

AN ACT to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. In order to provide for the several acts
- 2 and resolves of the legislature, requiring the payment of
- 3 money from the treasury, and also to provide for the
- 4 necessary expenditures of government for the current
- 5 fiscal year, the following sums are hereby appropriated
- 6 out of any moneys in the treasury, and the governor, with
- 7 the advice and consent of the council, is hereby authorized,
- 8 at any time prior to the first day of January next, to draw
- 9 his warrant on the treasury for the same:
- 10 Town of Machias, two hundred ninety-eight
- 11 dollars and two cents,
