AN ACT to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. In order to provide for the several acts  
2 and resolves of the legislature, requiring the payment of  
3 money from the treasury, and also to provide for the  
4 necessary expenditures of government for the current  
5 fiscal year, the following sums are hereby appropriated  
6 out of any moneys in the treasury, and the governor, with  
7 the advice and consent of the council, is hereby authorized,  
8 at any time prior to the first day of January next, to draw  
9 his warrant on the treasury for the same :
