STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE to provide for a state valuation.

Resolved, That the governor is hereby authorized, 2 with the advice and consent of the council, to immediately appoint a commission of five persons, one
of whom shall be taken from each of the five congressional districts within this state, and two at
large, to prepare a full, just and equal valuation of
the estates, and an enumeration of the polls subject to be taxed, as a basis of taxation for state
purposes, and to report the same to this legislature;
provided, such valuation shall be completed during
tits present session, or an adjourment thereof,
otherwise to report to the legislature of eighteen
hundred and eighty-one.

Resolved, That the commissioners thus appointed 2 shall hold their first session at the capitol at

3 Augusta, immediately after their appointment, and

4 shall proceed without delay to prepare said valua-5 tion, and shall sit at the same place without adjour-6 ment for more than two days at one time until the 7 preparation of said valuation is completed, or until 8 the final adjournment of this legislature. In case 9 the report of this commission cannot be completed 10 before said final adjournment, the same shall be 11 made to the next legislature on the first day of its Said commissioners shall give such pub-12 session. 13 lic notice of their session as they may deem proper, 14 and also a printed notice mailed to the assessors of 15 the several cities, towns and plantations, requiring 16 them to appear personally with, or transmit to 17 them immediately, unless the same have already 18 been transmitted to the secretary of state, the sev-19 eral tax and valuation lists and lists of taxable 20 polls of their several cities, towns and plantations, 21 for the years eighteen hundred seventy-seven, 22 eighteen hundred seventy-eight, and eighteen hun-23 dred and seventy-nine, containing the estates and 24 property taxable therein and the fair cash value of 25 each kind of property therein enumerated, as re-26 guired by law, and the correctness of said lists of 27 taxable polls and estates and the valuation of the 28 property therein enumerated for the year eighteen 29 hundred and seventy-nine, shall be verified by the 30 oath or affirmation of said several assessors or one 31 of them. Said commissioners shall have power to 32 summon before them and examine upon oath either 33 of said assessors, any town or city officer, or other 34 person, touching such lists and the amount and 35 value of the taxable property in said several cities, 36 towns and plantations, and all other matters con-37 nected therewith, and to require such person sum-38 moned to produce all records or other public docu-39 ments relating thereto. If the assessors of any 40 city, town or plantation, or one of them, shall fail 41 to appear before said commission or transmit to 42 them the lists above named within ten days after 43 the mailing and publication of said notices, the 44 said commissioners may in their discretion and 45 upon such other information as they may obtain, 46 report the valuation of the estates and property 47 and lists of polls, liable to taxation in such city, 48 town or plantation so in default, as they shall 49 deem just and equitable.

Resolved, That the land agent be and is hereby 2 required to immediately prepare and deliver to said 3 commissioners full and accurate lists of all town-4 ships or parts of townships or lots or parcels of 5 wild lands in this state sold and not included in 6 the tax lists, whether conveyed or not conveyed,

7 together with the fair value thereof, and to lay 8 before said commissioners all information in his 9 possession touching the value of wild lands when 10 required by them so to do; also a statement of all 11 lands on which timber has been sold, or a permit 12 or right to cut timber has been sold or granted by 13 lease or otherwise, together with the fair value 14 thereof. All other state officers shall in like man- 15 ner lay all information in their possession, touching 16 said valuation, before said commisssioners when 17 requested by them so to do.

Resolved, That the secretary of state shall imme2 diately notify each of said commissioners, of his
3 appointment. A majority of said commissioners
4 shall constitute a quorum. They may appoint a
5 chairman from their number and employ a suitable
6 clerk to keep their records, and such other clerks
7 as they deem necessary, not to exceed
8 in number unless this legislature shall otherwise
9 direct.

Resolved, That the secretary of state furnish to 2 said commissioners, for their use in preparing said 3 valuation all necessary stationery, blanks, blank-4 books, printed notices and summonses. That as a 5 full compensation for services said commissioners 6 shall each receive from the state treasury

- 7 dollars per day whilst actually engaged in prepar-
- 8 ing said valuation and making their report there-
- 9 on; and said clerks employed by said commission-
- 10 ers shall each in like manner receive not exceeding
- 11 two and fifty one-hundredths dollars per day whilst
- 12 actually employed in the duties of said commission.
- 13 Said commissioners and clerks shall be allowed
- 14 actual traveling expenses in once traveling to and
- 15 returning from Augusta. The accounts of said
- 16 commissioners and their clerks for services and
- 17 travel shall be audited by the council and when
- 18 the same are approved by them the governor shall
- 19 be authorized to draw his warrant upon the treas-
- 20 urer therefor.
