STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY.

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "an act to incorporate the city of Bangor," approved February twelve, eighteen hundred and thirty-four.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section five of chapter four hundred and thirty-

- 2 six of the private and special laws of eighteen
- 3 hundred thirty-four, entitled "an act to incorporate
- 4 the city of Bangor," approved February twelve,
- 5 eighteen hundred thirty-four, is hereby amended
- 6 so as to read as follows:
- 7 Sect. 5. That a board of city assessors, to con-
- 8 sist of not less than three nor more than seven
- 9\summammer members, shall be annually elected by the city
- 10 council, who shall exercise the same powers and be

11 subject to the same duties and liabilities as the 12 assessors of the several towns in the state may 13 exercise and are subject to under the laws of the 14 state; provided, however, that the city council may, 15 in the first instance, elect a part of said board to 16 hold their office for one year, a part for two years 17 and a part for three years, and, by election, fill all 18 existing vacancies; provided, however, that the 19 assessors shall appoint for assistant assessors one 20 person in each ward, said appointment to be sub-21 ject to the approval of the mayor and aldermen, 22 whose duty it shall be to furnish the assessors with 23 all necessary information relative to persons and 24 property taxable in his ward, who shall be sworn 25 or affirmed to the faithful performance of his duty. 26 All taxes shall be assessed and apportioned and 27 collected in the manner provided by the laws of 28 this state relative to town taxes; provided, however, 29 that it shall and may be lawful for the city council 30 to establish further and additional provisions for 31 the collection thereof.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-2 proved by the governor.
