STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treas2 ury, to be expended under the direction of the
3 governor and council, to the agent of the Passama4 quoddy tribe of Indians, for the benefit of said
5 tribe, as follows, viz: For May dividend, four
6 hundred dollars; for November dividend, three
7 hundred dollars; for distressed poor, two thousand
8 dollars; for agricultural purposes, six hundred
9 dollars; for bounty on crops for the year eighteen
10 hundred and eighty, three hundred dollars; for
11 ploughing, one hundred and fifty dollars; for sala12 ries of governors, one hundred dollars; for sala13 of lieutenant governors, forty dollars; for wood,
14 two hundred dollars; for repairs on road from
15 Peter Dana's point to Granger turnpike, fifty dol-

16 lars; for contingent expenses, one hundred dollars; 17 for educational purposes, four hundred dollars, to 18 be expended under the supervision of the agent of 19 said tribe and the resident priest; for salary of 20 priest, one hundred dollars; for dressing for land, 21 one hundred dollars; for salary of agent, two hun-22 dred dollars; for contingent poor fund, five hun-23 dred dollars.
