STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE making appropriations for the Penobscot tribe of Indians for the year eighteen hundred and eighty.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treas-2 ury to the agent of the Penobscot tribe of Indians,

3 to be appropriated for the benefit of said tribe, as

4 follows: forty-four hundred twenty-nine dollars

5 and seventy cents, amount of interest on their trust

6 fund, held by the state for the benefit of said tribe;

7 fourteen hundred dollars for their annual annuity,

8 seven hundred dollars for agricultural purposes,

9 four hundred and fifty dollars for bounty on crops,

10 two hundred dollars for salary of agent; one hun-

11 dred dollars to pay competent persons, to be em-

12 ployed by the agent, to assist and instruct said

13 Indians in their agricultural labors, as follows: fifty

14 dollars on Oldtown and Orson islands; twenty-five 15 dollars on Mattanawcook island, twenty-five dol-16 lars on Hemlock, Sugar and Olamon islands, on the 17 same conditions as required by chapter ninety-six 18 of the resolves of eighteen hundred sixty-seven; 19 four hundred thirty-five dollars for schools, to be 20 used in employing competent teachers, viz: three hun-21 dred dollars on Oldtown island, under the supervision 22 of the agent of said tribe and the resident priest; 23 seventy-five dollars on Olamon island, under the 24 supervision of the superintending school committee 25 of Greenbush; sixty dollars on Mattanawcook 26 island, under the supervision of the superintending 27 school committee of Lincoln; and said committees 28 are required to report, as directed in resolve ap-29 proved March seventeenth, eighteen hundred and 30 sixty; and it is the duty of said agent to see that 31 the money is fully expended for the education of 32 the children of said tribe; one hundred dollars for 33 salary of their priest, provided he says mass at least 34 twenty-four Sundays during the year with said 35 tribe of Indians; fifty dollars for salary of their 36 governor; thirty dollars for salary of their lieuten-37 ant governor, fifty dollars for repairs on chapel, 38 four hundred and fifty dollars for the purpose of

- 39 building a new schoolhouse on Oldtown island; all
- 40 the foregoing sums to be paid under the direction
- 41 of the governor and council.
