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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND  
EIGHTY.

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AN ACT to incorporate the town of Woodland.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. The plantation hitherto known by  
2 the name of Woodland, in the county of Aroos-  
3 took, bounded on the north by New Sweden plan-  
4 tation, on the east by Caribou, on the south by  
5 Washburn, and on the west by Perham plantation,  
6 embracing that tract of land included in township  
7 numbered fourteen in range three, west of the east  
8 line of the state, agreeably to the state survey, be  
9 and hereby is incorporated into a town by the name  
10 of Woodland, and the inhabitants of said town are  
11 hereby vested with all the powers, privileges and

12 immunities which the inhabitants of towns within  
13 this state do or may by law enjoy.

SECT. 2. Any justice of the peace within said  
2 county is hereby empowered to issue his warrant  
3 to some inhabitant of said town, directing him to  
4 notify the inhabitants thereof to meet at such  
5 time and place as he shall appoint, to choose such  
6 officers and transact such business as other towns  
7 are empowered to do at their annual town meet-  
8 ings.

SECT. 3. Said town of Woodland shall be en-  
2 titled to vote in the choice of a representative to  
3 the legislature of this state, in the same district  
4 and in the same manner as it was allowed and  
5 authorized to do previous to the passing of this  
6 act, and shall continue a part of the aforesaid dis-  
7 trict until otherwise provided by law.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
