STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY.

AN ACT to further provide for safety of travel on
railroads.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. Any person who shall behave in a
2 disorderly or riotous manner while on a train of
3 cars on any railroad in this state, or shall use inde-
4 cent or profane language in the cars of such train,
5 shall be deemed guilty of a breach of the peace,
6 and, upon conviction, be liable to a fine of not less
7 than five nor more than five hundred dollars, or
8 imprisonment in the county jail not less than thirty
9 days nor more than one year; but this act shall not
10 relieve such person from any other penalty pre-
11 scribed by law.

SECT. 2. It shall be lawful for the conductor of
2 a train of cars on any railroad in this state to arrest
3 and temporarily hold any person guilty of such
4 breach of the peace, until a warrant can be ob-
5 tained, or he be placed in custody of the proper
6 officers of the law.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
