## STATE OF MAINE.

**RESOLVE** in favor of the state library.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred and fifty 2 dollars be and the same is appropriated, to 3 purchase a full set of lithographed maps of the 4 northeastern boundary of the United States, that 5 the same may be placed in the library of the state.

Dear Sir:—Since writing to you, this morning, I have received a letter from Albany, N. Y., in which I am informed that there are thirty-nine maps in the complete set, and that they are but slightly damaged, (having been saved from a fire), but they require to be backed and bound, the expense of which, with a suitable case, express expenses, &c., may amount to about \$150, delivered at Augusta. If desired to have them backed and bound (as they ought to be) it can be done in Philadelphia at a probable cost of \$2 each. If I can give you any aid in this matter, I shall be glad to do so.
