STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY.

AN ACT to incorporate the Parlin Pond Dam Com-
pany.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. Charles B. Foster, Joseph Spaulding,
2 their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby
3 created a body politic and corporate by the name
4 of the Parlin pond dam company, with all the
5 powers and privileges of similar corporations.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may erect and main-
2 tain a dam at the foot of Parlin pond in township
3 number three, in the seventh range of the Kenne-
4 bec million acre purchase in Somerset county, for
5 the purpose of raising a head of water in said
6 Parlin pond, to facilitate the driving logs down
7 Parlin stream into Moose river; and said corpora-

8 tion may remove rocks, build and maintain dams
9 and side dams, and make other improvements on the
10 Parlin stream below said pond. And said corpora-
11 tion may take and hold land and materials for the
12 purpose of locating and constructing their dam
13 and dams and making their improvements, and
14 may flow contiguous lands; and the said corpora-
15 tion shall pay to the proprietor or proprietors of
16 land and materials so taken or land flowed, such
17 sum as the parties agree upon; and if the parties
18 do not agree then the corporation shall pay such
19 damages as may be determined by the county com-
20 missioners of the county of Somerset, and the same
21 proceedings shall be had as in the case of damage
22 in the laying out of highways, with same right to
23 have a jury assess the damages.

SECT. 3. The said corporation may demand and
2 receive, as a toll for all logs and lumber which may
3 pass over or through their dam at the foot of Parlin
4 pond, the sum of fifteen cents for each thousand
5 feet, board measure, full scale, and the corporation
6 shall have a lien on all logs and lumber that may
7 pass over or through the said dam at the foot of
8 Parlin pond, for the payment of such tolls; and if
9 the polls are not paid within thirty days from the
10 time the logs or lumber, or a major part of them or

11 it, shall arrive at the point, where they come under
12 the control of the Moose river log driving compa-
13 ny, the corporation may sell so much of said logs
14 or lumber at public auction, in the city of Gardiner,
15 after giving ten days' notice, at least, in some news-
16 paper printed in Gardiner or Augusta, of the time
17 and place of sale, as may be sufficient to pay the
18 tolls and incidental charges; but the logs or lumber
19 of each particular mark shall be holden only to pay
20 the toll of such mark.

SECT. 4. Either of the corporators named in this
2 act may call the first meeting of said corporation
3 by giving personal notice to each of the other cor-
4 porators, of the time and place of said meeting,
5 four days prior thereto.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
