STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY.

AN ACT relating to telephone companies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. The National Bell Telephone Company of the state of Maine shall have no right to locate, construct or operate lines of telephone within the limits of any other telephone company charter granted by the legislature of eighteen hundred and eighty, or of previous years, until the companies named in the other charters aforesaid are granted at reasonable rates the use and full benefits for their own lines of all telephone boxes and instruments necessary to operate said lines.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
