## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and sixtythree of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-seven.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section one of chapter one hundred and sixty-

- 2 three of the public laws of eighteen hundred and
- 3 seventy-seven, is hereby amended, by inserting
- 4 after the word "corporation" in the third line, the
- 5 words "or steamboat," and by adding to said sec-
- 6 tion the words "or officer or agent of such steam-
- 7 boat;" and section four of said chapter, is hereby
- 8 amended, by inserting after the word "corpora-
- 9 tions" in the second line of said section, the words
- 10 "and steamboats," and after the word "company"
- 11 in the fourth line of said fourth section, the words

- 12 "and route of steamboats," so that said sections,
- 13 as amended, shall read as follows:
- 14 Sect. 1. No person or persons shall loiter or
- 15 remain, without right, within any car, station house
- 16 of a railroad corporation or steamboat, or upon the
- 17 platform or grounds adjoining such station, after
- 18 being requested to leave the same by any railroad
- 19 officer or officer or agent of such steamboat.
- 20 Sect. 4. It shall be the duty of the officers of
- 21 the several railroad corporations and steamboats
- 22 in this state, to have posted in a conspicuous place
- 23 at the several depots along the line of the road of
- 24 the company and route of steamboats, a copy of
- 25 the above law.
