IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend section forty, chapter three of the revised statutes, relating to city ordinances.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Section forty, chapter three of the
- 2 revised statutes, is hereby amended, by adding at
- 3 the end thereof the following:
- 4 Eleventh-Any city may establish ordinances
- 5 regulating the purchase and sale of old junk, and
- 6 metals, and other articles usually bought by old
- 7 junk dealers, and may therein prescribe such con-
- 8 ditions to be observed by buyers and sellers as the
- 9 city officers may deem best, to prevent or detect
- 10 the sale or purchase of stolen goods; and suitable
- 11 penalties may be prescribed in such ordinances for
- 12 any violation thereof.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-2 proved.
