STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend section forty, chapter three of
the revised statutes, relating to city ordinances.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. Section forty, chapter three of the
2 revised statutes, is hereby amended, by adding at
3 the end thereof the following:

4 Eleventh—Any city may establish ordinances
5 regulating the purchase and sale of old junk, and
6 metals, and other articles usually bought by old
7 junk dealers, and may therein prescribe such con-
8 ditions to be observed by buyers and sellers as the
9 city officers may deem best, to prevent or detect
10 the sale or purchase of stolen goods; and suitable
11 penalties may be prescribed in such ordinances for
12 any violation thereof.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-
2 proved.
