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## STATE OF MAINE.

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RESOLVE in favor of the town of Mayfield.

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*Resolved,* That three hundred dollars be appropriated to assist the town of Mayfield in building a road leading from Brighton Center to Kingsbury Mills, through said town of Mayfield, the same to be expended under the direction of the county commissioners of Somerset county: *Provided,* that said town of Mayfield shall raise and expend an equal sum on said road.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS.

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The town of Mayfield contains but forty-nine voters. By chapter 76 of the resolves of 1878, three hundred dollars were appropriated to aid in the construction of the road named in the foregoing resolve. In May following the passage of that resolve, the inhabitants of Mayfield petitioned the county commissioners for the laying out of said road, but were unable to get a hearing before the following October, and consequently did not have time to expend their money before the 1st of January, 1879, when the term of office of the Governor expired, and no warrant was drawn in their favor.

The town has already expended over three hundred dollars in the construction of said road, and it is not yet completed, and they are unable to finish it. As they have received nothing from the State, they therefore ask that they may receive the amount originally appropriated to them in order to enable them to complete the road.
