STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend section twenty-eight, chapter two, of the revised statutes, relating to notice upon petitions to the legislature.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section twenty-eight, of chapter two, of the revised statutes, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following, viz: "But if deemed expedient by any legislative committee to which a petition is referred, notice to persons and corporations interested may be ordered by such committee during a session of the legislature, so that said section as amended will read:

9 *Sect. 28.* Petitions mentioned in the preceding
10 sections without proof of notice as prescribed,

11 shall be referred with an order of notice to the
12 next legislature; but if deemed expedient by any
13 legislative committee to which a petition is re-
14 ferred, reasonable notice to persons and corpora-
15 tions interested may be ordered by such committee,
16 and action taken thereon during a session of the
17 legislature.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-
2 proved.
