STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT for the speedy detection and punishment of crime.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section. 1. Whenever there shall appear to the

- 2 governor probable cause to believe that the offense
- 3 of murder has been committed in this state, and
- 4 there is need of special investigation to discover
- 5 the perpetrators thereof, the governor may, upon
- 6 the application of the attorney general, or of the
- 7 county attorney of the county in which such
- 8 offense is believed to have been committed, author-
- 9 ize either of said officers to employ some civil
- 10 officer or other suitable person to conduct such
- 11 investigation.

Sect. 2. Such officer or person so employed

- 2 shall be paid his necessary expenses and reason-
- •3 able compensation by the state for his services,
 - 4 and his account therefor shall be approved by
 - 5 the attorney general and such county attorney,
 - 6 and audited by the governor and council.
