STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and eighty-
two of the public laws of eighteen hundred and
seventy-four.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Section one of chapter one hundred and eighty-
two of the public laws of eighteen hundred and
seventy-four is hereby amended, so as to read as
follows:

“ Whenever any goods, merchandise, packages
or parcels, transported by any railroad, steamboat,
express or stage company, shall remain unclaimed
for six months; or any goods, merchandise, or
other articles of personal property shall remain in
any public warehouse for six months after the

11 charges thereon shall be rightfully demanded and
12 left unpaid, the same may be sold by auction to
13 pay the charges thereon, and the expense of adver-
14 tising and selling the same.”
