STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Washington.

Resolved, That there be paid by the treasurer of 2 state, out of the school funds of the current year; 3 to the town of Washington, the sum of one hun-4 dred and twenty-eight dollars and three cents, it 5 being a balance equitably due said town as its 6 proportion of the school funds for the year eigh-7 teen hundred and eighty.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The undersigned, supervisor of schools in the town of Washington, in the county of Knox, hereby certifies that in making his annual school returns to the superintendent of common schools, he certified that there were in said town, on the 1st day of April, 1880, the number of 309 scholars; that the actual number of scholars in said town, as enumerated and returned to him by the several school agents, was 397; and that the error by him made in said return was discovered by him too late to correct said return before the state school funds had been apportioned by the state treasurer to the several towns in the state, in consequence whereof the said town of Washington suffered loss of school money that should have been apportioned to 88 scholars.
