STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of French Spoliation Claims.

WHEREAS, The commerce of the United States 2 was unlawfully preyed upon by the French gov-3 ernment previous to A. D. eighteen hundred, at a 4 time when said nation and the United States were 5 at peace, thereby destroying the property of citi-6 zens of this state as well as of several other states. 7 of the nation, to the amount of several millions of 8 dollars; and whereas, in the treaty of September 9 thirty, A. D. eighteen hundred, the United States, 10 in accordance with previous demands, received 11 compensation for said property, known as the 12 "French Spoliation Claims," with the positive 13 agreement that the indemnities due by France to 14 the citizens of the United States should be paid by 15 the United States; and whereas, said claims have 16 never been paid to these sufferers or their heirs; and

- 17 whereas, said claims have been and are now uni-
- 18 versally acknowledged justly due these claimants,
- 19 and a bill praying said claims having twice passed
- 20 both branches of Congress, lacking only the sig-
- 21 nature of the President to become a law; therefore Resolved, That we earnestly urge Congress and
 - 2 our own legislators there, especially, to bring the
 - 3 matter up for action during the present congress

 Resolved, That a copy of this resolution be sent
 - 2 to each of our congressional legislators.
