AN ACT to provide in part for the expenditures of  
government.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. In order to provide for the several acts  
2 and resolves of the legislature requiring the pay-  
3 ment of money from the treasury, and also to provide  
4 for the necessary expenditures of government for  
5 the fiscal year eighteen hundred eighty-one, the  
6 following sums are hereby appropriated out of any  
7 moneys in the treasury, and the governor, with the  
8 advice and consent of the council, is hereby author-  
9 ized, at any time prior to the first day of January  
10 next, to draw his warrant on the treasury for the  
11 same:
