STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE relating to Hell Gate Pilot Laws.

The Senate and House of Representatives of the 2 State of Maine in Legislature assembled, to the 3 General Assembly of the State of New York, 4 sends greeting:

5 WHEREAS, At the last session of the legislature 6 resolutions were adopted, calling the attention of 7 your honorable bodies to the Hell Gate pilot laws; 8 and whereas, the ship owners of this state are justly 9 indignant at the compulsory pilot laws of your 10 state, which compel their vessels, using the pas-11 sage through the sound to the sea, to pay pilotage 12 whether their services are required or not, impos-13 ing a burden not warranted by the constitution of 14 the United States; and whereas, the government 15 of the United States has expended millions of dol-16 lars in removing the reefs in said passage, making

17 it comparatively safe for vessels passing through,18 and rendering the services of a pilot unnecessary,19 therefore

Resolved, That we respectfully ask your honor-2 able bodies to so amend said laws that the griev-3 ances of our citizens may be removed, and as in 4 duty bound your memorialists will ever pray.

Resolved, That a printed copy of this memorial 2 be transmitted to the president of the Senate and 3 speaker of the House of Assembly of the State of 4 New York by the secretary of state.
