### STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Kingsbury.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the state is

- 2 authorized and directed to pay the sum of three
- 3 hundred dollars to the town of Kingsbury, the
- 4 same being for pauper supplies furnished the
- 5 family of John Liston, consisting of thirteen per-
- 6 sons, who have heretofore been supported by the
- 7 state.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The town of Kingsbury has a population of 198, a resident valuation of twelve thousand dollars. Ten years ago a family of state paupers of thirteen, moved into town. To support schools and to defray necessary town expenses the past ten years, the assessment has been three per cent.; to have been obliged to have supported the state paupers an assessment of seven per cent. would had to have been made each year, which the people could not possibly pay.
