STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred ninety-
three of the public laws of eighteen hundred and
seventy-four, relating to clerks of judicial courts.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter one hundred
2 and ninety-three, public laws of eighteen hun-
3 dred and seventy-four is hereby amended, so as to
4 read as follows:

5 *Sect. 1.* From and after the passage of this
6 act, clerks of judicial courts shall make extended
7 records of proceedings in court, in all actions con-
8 tested by an issue joined before the court or jury,
9 in actions of flowage, cases in equity, real actions,

10 libels for divorce, petitions for partition, petitions
11 to enforce liens, and actions upon mortgages, with-
12 out unreasonable delay after the rendition of final
13 judgment. In all other cases it shall be sufficient
14 to record the names of the parties, date of writ, the
15 term of the court at which entered, date of service
16 or notice to defendants, the time of rendition of
17 judgment, its nature and amount, and the number
18 of case upon the docket at the judgment term, and
19 that upon motion of either party the court may,
20 if special cause be shown, order a full record in
21 any case.

SECT. 2. Section two of chapter one hundred
2 and ninety-three of the public laws of eighteen
3 hundred and seventy-four is hereby repealed.
