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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE.

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AN ACT to amend section one of chapter one hundred and twenty-eight (128) of the revised statutes, relating to unwholesome provisions and drinks.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

That section one, of chapter one hundred and  
2 twenty-eight, be amended by striking out the  
3 words "without informing the buyer," in next to  
4 the last line of said section, so it shall read as fol-  
5 lows:

6 *Sect. 1.* Whoever sells any diseased, corrupted,  
7 or unwholesome provision for food or drink, know-  
8 ing it to be such, without informing the buyer; or  
9 fraudulently adulterates for the purpose of sale,  
10 any substance intended for food, or any wine,

11 spirits, or other liquors intended for drink, so as  
12 to render them injurious to health, shall be pun-  
13 ished by imprisonment not more than five years, or  
14 by fine not exceeding one thousand dollars; and  
15 whoever knowingly sells or offers for sale as food,  
16 any veal killed before the calf was four weeks old,  
17 shall be punished by a fine of not more than twenty  
18 dollars, or by imprisonment not more than thirty  
19 days.
