## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT to incorporate the Skowhegan and Athens Railroad Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. J. S. Tobey, F. G. Greene, Edward

- 2 Ware, S. L. Tobey, O. W. McIntire, Albert Leavitt,

- 4 M. B. Smiley, L. T. Pike, J. C. Kinsman, B. F.
- 5 Eaton, A. S. C. Hall, D. F. Hobart, Reuben Hus-
- 6 sey, J. W. Hussey, J. F. Holman, E. S. Dutton,
- 7 O. L. Bush, A. C. Wade, J. H. Hight, B. M. Hight,
- 8 Tom H. Howard, Henry Leavitt, and their asso-
- 9 clates, are hereby created a body corporate by the
- 10 name of the Skowhegan and Athens Railroad Com-
- 11 pany, with all the powers, rights and priviliges,
- 12 and subject to all the duties, obligations and re-

13 strictions conferred and imposed by the laws of the 14 state.

SECT. 2. Said corporation is authorized to locate,

- 2 construct, maintain and operate a railroad of a
- 3 gauge not exceeding three feet, and not less than
- 4 two feet, from some point in Skowhegan village,
- 5 through East Madison Lower Mills in the town of
- 6 Madison, and through the town of Cornville to
- 7 Athens village, with the right to connect with the
- 8 Maine Central railroad in Skowhegan.
  - Sect. 3. The capital stock of said corporation
- 2 shall consist of not less than seven hundred and
- 3 twenty, nor more than three thousand shares, of
- 4 fifty dollars each.
- Sect. 4. Said corporation may sell or lease its
- 2 line and all its improvements to any other rail-
- 3 road corporation, which latter company is hereby
- 4 authorized to enter into such contract of sale or
- 5 lease, and the directors of the two corporations
- 6 may enter into such contract for the running of
- 7 the road, and for the purchase, sale or lease thereof,
- 8 as the directors of the two companies, in the exer-
- 9 cise of their best judgment and discretion, may
- 10 deem for the advantage of their respective corpor-
- 11 ations, subject to the approval of the stockholders
- 12 in each corporation.

- Sect. 5. The officers of said corporation shall
- 2 be a president, clerk, treasurer, board of directors,
- 3 and such others as may be provided in the by-laws.
- 4 The powers and duties of the officers shall be such
- 5 as may be prescribed in the by-laws and rules of
- 6 the corporation.
  - Sect. 6. If the said corporation shall not have
- 2 been organized, and the location, according to the
- 3 actual survey of the route to Athens, have been
- 4 filed with the county commissioners of the county
- 5 of Somerset, on or before the first day of January,
- 6 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hun-
- 7 dred and eighty-three; or if said corporation shall
- 8 fail to complete said railroad to Athens, on or
- 9 before the first day of January, in the year of our
- 10 Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five,
- 11 in either of the above mentioned cases, this act
- 12 shall be null and void.
  - SECT. 7. This charter is granted because the
  - 2 railroad herein provided for would run in the same
  - 3 general direction as the Somerset railroad already
  - 4 constructed, and within ten miles of the same, so
  - 5 that the object of this corporation cannot be attained
  - 6 under the general laws for the formation of railroad
  - 7 coporations.
