STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT providing for holding one term annually
of the supreme judicial court at Caribou, in the
county of Aroostook.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. There shall be three terms of the
2 supreme judicial court in the county of Aroostook
3 in each year, as follows: at Houlton on the last
4 Tuesday of February, and the third Tuesday of
5 September, and at Caribou on the first Tuesday of
6 December; *Provided* said town of Caribou, or
7 individuals therein, shall, on or before the first day
8 of August, eighteen hundred and eighty-one, fur-
9 nish, free from expense to said county, suitable
10 accommodations for the holding of said court, to

11 the acceptance and approval of the county com-
12 missioners of said county, and shall execute and
13 deliver to said commissioners a sufficient lease or
14 other instrument, to secure to said county the use
15 of such court accommodations at Caribou, during
16 such time as said court shall be holden at Caribou,
17 which may be renewed from time to time as occa-
18 sion may require.

SECT. 2. The said commissioners shall cause a
2 record of such instrument to be made by their
3 clerk, and shall thereupon cause a notice of the
4 fact that such provision has been made, and of its
5 acceptance by them, to be published in the Aroos-
6 took Republican, a newspaper published at said
7 Caribou, three consecutive weeks, and they shall
8 also notify the chief justice of the state thereof.
