## STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of John M. Thurlough.

---

*Resolved*, that the sum of two hundred and  
2 twenty-five dollars, collected by the land agent,  
3 August nineteen, eighteen hundred and seventy-  
4 eight, for trespass committed on lot number one  
5 hundred fourteen, in township F, range one, Aroos-  
6 took county, be appropriated and paid to John M.  
7 Thurlough, said lot having been certificated to said  
8 Thurlough October twenty-four, eighteen hundred  
9 and seventy-six, and conveyed to him by the state,  
10 November fifteen, eighteen hundred and seventy-  
11 eight, said Thurlough being now the actual owner  
12 of said lot.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS.

---

This lot was contracted by the State to Mr. Thurlough, October 14, 1876. During the following winter, while Mr. Thurlough was absent from the county, one Hillman committed trespass upon the lot, and the fee of the land being in the State, the Land Agent initiated proceedings for the collection of the stumpage, which he succeeded in doing from Messrs. Madigan and Donworth, of Houlton, August 19, 1878.

John H. Bolster, local agent of said township, in a certificate to the Land Agent, dated October 25, 1878, certified that Mr. Thurlough had performed all duties required by law, and the lot was accordingly conveyed to said Thurlough by the State, November 15, 1878, and he is now the actual owner of the same. Mr. Thurlough now claims to be reimbursed for the stumpage referred to. The resolve has the unanimous endorsement of the Committee on State Lands and State Roads.
