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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND  
EIGHTY-ONE.

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AN ACT to incorporate the Junction Railway Com-  
pany of Portland.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Samuel E. Spring, Jacob McLellan, George E.  
2 B. Jackson, S. J. Anderson, H. N. Jose and  
3 Philip Henry Brown are hereby constituted a cor-  
4 poration under the style of "the Junction Railway  
5 Company of Portland," with a capital stock not  
6 exceeding two million dollars, with authority to  
7 locate, construct and operate a railway in or  
8 through the towns of Deering, Westbrook, Cape  
9 Elizabeth and Portland, or parts of them; and to  
10 cross any navigable waters adjoining thereto, for  
11 the purpose of connecting the business of the rail-  
12 roads centering at Portland, or part of them, and

13 with authority to erect, own and maintain wharves,  
14 warehouses and elevators connected with the said  
15 railroad, and with authority to lease connecting  
16 roads or part of them. Said corporation shall  
17 have all the rights, and be subject to all the liabil-  
18 ities of railroads, as provided by the laws of Maine;  
19 but shall not pass above any way or street in the  
20 city of Portland except with the consent of the city  
21 council; nor along Commercial street, between  
22 State and India streets, without the consent of the  
23 Portland, Saco & Portsmouth Railroad Company,  
24 and the Atlantic & St. Lawrence Railroad Com-  
25 pany; nor along the route, nor through the  
26 station grounds of any railroad company, without  
27 the consent of said company; nor across tide  
28 waters without the consent of, and subject to such  
29 conditions as may be prescribed by the harbor  
30 commissioners, and shall be subject to all the laws  
31 relating to Portland harbor.
