## STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE making appropriations for the Penobscot tribe of Indians for the years eighteen hundred eighty-one and eighteen hundred and eighty-two.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treas-2 ury to the agent of the Penobscot tribe of Indians, 3 to be appropriated for the benefit of said tribe, each 4 year, as follows: Forty-four hundred twenty-nine 5 dollars and seventy cents, amount of interest on 6 their trust fund held by the state for the benefit of 7 said tribe; fifteen hundred dollars for their annual 8 annuity each year; seven hundred dollars for agri-9 cultural purposes each year; four hundred and fifty 10 dollars for bounty on crops each year; two hun-11 dred dollars for salary of agent for each year; six 12 hundred dollars for schools each year, to be used 13 in employing competent teachers, viz: four hundred 14 dollars for Oldtown island, under the supervision of

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15 said tribe and resident priest, seventy-five dollars 16 on Olamon island, under the supervision of the 17 superintending school committee of Greenbush; 18 one hundred and twenty-five dollars on Mattanaw-19 cook island, under the supervision of the superin-20 tending school committee of Lincoln; and said 21 committees are required to report as directed in 22 resolve approved March seventeen, eighteen hun-23 dred and sixty, and it shall be the duty of said 24 agent to see that the money is fully expended for 25 the education of the children of the tribe; one hun-26 dred dollars for the salary of said priest, for each 27 year, provided he says mass at least twenty-four 28 Sundays during the year for said tribe of Indians; 29 fifty dollars for salary of their governor, each year; 30 thirty dollars for salary of their lieutenant governor 31 each year; two hundred and fifty dollars for repairs 32 on chapel, this sum is in addition to fifty dollars 33 appropriated under resolve dated March fifteenth, 34 eighteen hundred and eighty, unexpended, and is 35 in full for repairs on said chapel, for the years 36 eighteen hundred eighty-one and eighteen hundred . 37 eighty-two. All the foregoing sums to be paid 38 under the direction of the governor and council.
