STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT in relation to soldiers and sailors who receive aid from towns or cities.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. No soldier or sailor who has served

- 2 by enlistment a term of nine months in the army
- 3 or navy of the United States, in the civil war of
- 4 eighteen hundred and sixty-one, and has received
- 5 an honorable discharge therefrom, or having so
- 6 enlisted has been honorably discharged by reason
- 7 of wounds or of disease contracted in such service,
- 8 who may become dependent upon any town or city
- 9 in this state, shall be considered a pauper or be
- 10 disfranchised for that cause. The expenses in-
- 11 curred by any town or city in furnishing supplies

- 12 to such person, may be recovered of the town or 13 city where he has his settlement, in the manner 14 provided by chapter twenty-four of the revised 15 statutes.
 - SECT. 2. Chapter twenty-one, of the public 2 laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-five, and 3 section four of chapter two hundred and three of 4 the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-5 four, are hereby repealed.
