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## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend chapter two hundred and six of the public laws of eighteen hundred and eighty, relating to suits by collectors of taxes and the jurisdiction of trial justices.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Chapter two hundred and six (206) of the public

- 2 laws of eighteen hundred and eighty, is hereby
- 3 amended by adding thereto the following words:
- 4 "and no trial justice or judge of any municipal or
- 5 police court, before whom such suit is brought,
- 6 shall be deemed incompetent to try the same by
- 7 reason of his residence in the town assessing said
- 8 tax," so that said chapter shall read as follows:
- 9 "Any collector of taxes, or any executor or
- 10 administrator of a deceased collector of taxes, may,

- 11 after due notice, sue, in his own name, for any
- 12 tax in any court competent to try the same, and
- 13 no trial justice or judge of any municipal or police
- 14 court, before whom such suit is brought, shall be
- 15 deemed incompetent to try the same by reason of
- 16 his residence in the town assessing said tax."
