STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend section one hundred and sixtyeight, chapter two hundred and twenty-five, public laws of eighteen hundred and eighty, relating to the militia.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

That section one hundred and sixty-eight, chap-2 ter two hundred and twenty-five, public laws of 3 eighteen hundred and eighty, is hereby amended, 4 by inserting after the word "sold" in the fourth 5 and fifth lines, the words "or exchanged," so that 6 said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

7 Sect. 168. The inspector general, or such other
8 officer as the commander-in-chief may designate,
9 shall inspect and condemn public military property
10 which has or may become unfit for use; and no

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11 property shall be sold or exchanged until it has 12 become unfit for use; and no property shall be 13 sold or exchanged until it has been inspected and 14 condemned as herein provided, and such condem-15 nation approved by the commander-in-chief. The 16 proceeds of all sales of condemned military prop-17 erty shall be paid into the treasury of the state and 18 used for military purposes.
